

# NEW PLANE CARRIER TO VOYAGE TO PERU

## Demonstration Will Be Given by Ranger at Technical Aviation Conference

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27.—The aircraft carrier Ranger, the navy's newest and swiftest craft in that category, will be sent to Callao, at the request of the Peruvian Government to give a demonstration of naval aviation operations. The occasion will be the assembly of the Inter-American Technical Aviation Conference at Lima, Sept. 16.

The Ranger will carry seventy-eight planes, and will be accompanied by two destroyers, the Worden and the Hull.

The Department of Commerce, the Weather Bureau and the Federal Communications Commission will also be represented at the gathering.
