## NEW PLANE CARRIER TO VOYAGE TO PERU

## Demonstration Will Be Given by Ranger at Technical Aviation Conference

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27.-The aircraft carrier Ranger, the navy's newest and swiftest craft in that category, will be sent to Callao, at the request of the Peruvian Government to give a demonstration of naval aviation operations. The occasion will be the assembly of the Inter-American Technical Aviation

Conference at Lima, Sept. 16. The Ranger will carry seventyeight planes, and will be accompanied by two destroyers, the Wor-

den and the Hull.

The Department of Commerce, the Weather Bureau and the Federal Communications Commission will also be represented at the gathering.
