York at the opening of the World's Fair on April 30 and remain until May 17, the Navy Department announced today.

After completing manoeuvres in the Atlantic this Winter, the fleet will visit Caribbean and West Indies ports, then assemble in the Guantanamo area for tactical, gunnery and miscellaneous exercises before proceeding to East Coast ports and the World's Fair.

It will visit the Hampton Roads-Yorktown area from April 15 to April 27.

Later, from May 18 to May 21, certain units of the fleet will again visit that area. Prior to their visit to New York, ships of the submarine force will visit New London, Conn.

Navy to Station Vessels Here Under Admiral Bloch

WASHINGTON, Jan. 14.—One hundred and nineteen naval vessels, with Admiral Claude C. Bloch, Commander in Chief of the United States Fleet, on his flagship, the battleship Pennsylvania, and patrol squadrons and Aircraft 1 of the fleet marine force will visit New
